Ken Inoue

Senior Advisor at JICA/ Former Director and Chief Governance Advisor at UNMIT/ Former Municipal Administrator at UNMIK

Mr. Ken Inoue is Senior Advisor on Democratic Governance at Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) since April 2015. Prior to this, he served at various United Nations Peacekeeping Operations including UNMIT (Timor-Leste) as Director and Chief Governance Advisor of Democratic Governance Support Unit, UNMIK (Kosovo) as Municipal Administrator, UNOSOM II (Somalia) as Regional Humanitarian Affairs Officer, and UNTAC (Cambodia) as Deputy Provincial Director. He also served at Asian Productivity Organization (Tokyo), United Nations Volunteers (Geneva and Bonn), Office of the SRSG for Cambodia Humanitarian Assistance (Bangkok), UNDP (Trinidad & Tobago) and World Bank (Washington D.C.). He has also been an advisor of the UNITAR Peacekeeping Training Programme Advisory Board since 2013. He holds a B.A. of Political Science from University of Waseda and a M.Phil. Development Studies from Institute of Development Studies, University of Sussex.



Mbuli Charles Boliko

Director of the FAO Liaison Office in Japan

Dr. Mbuli Charles Boliko, a national of the Democratic Republic of the Congo, holds a Bachelor's degree in Psychology and a Master's degree in Industrial Psychology from the University of Kisangani, D.R. Congo. He taught at the Institut Supérieur de Commerce (Business College) in Kinshasa, D.R. Congo from 1988 to 1990, and joined Nagoya University where he became one of the first students who started the Graduate School of International Development (GSID) in April 1991; he obtained a Master's degree in International Development in 1993 and a Ph. D. in the same area in 1996. After a bit over one-year of teaching at GSID, Dr. Boliko joined FAO in Rome as Personnel Officer in 1997. From 1998 to 2003, he served as Liaison Officer in the FAO Liaison Office with the United Nations in New York, before being transferred to the Office of the Director-General in Rome as Attaché de Cabinet, and was promoted to the position of Senior Attaché de Cabinet in 2008. In 2009, he took up the position. In August 2013, Dr. Boliko was appointed Director of the FAO Liaison Office in Japan. He is also a Visiting Professor of the Catholic University of the Congo where he teaches "Human Resource Management" and "Administration and Development".



Koichi Omori

Senior Communications Officer, Tokyo Office, World Bank

Koichi Omori joined the World Bank in 2000 as a junior communications associate, and contributed to expand the World Bank's outreach programs for civil society, university/think-tank and private sector in Japan. In January 2010, he became Special Assistant to the Vice President for South Asia Region, based in the headquarters in Washington DC. In May 2014 he moved to Tokyo Office again, and in November 2015 he assumed the current position. Prior to joining the World Bank, he was a chair research associate at a research institute in university in Japan, conducting research projects on conservation and development in Indonesia. Koichi obtained MA in International Relations from Ritsumeikan University and MA in International Relations from School of International Service, American University.

Toru Kodama

Associate Professor, University of Tsukuba/ Associate Economist, Institute for International Trade and Investment

Before joining the University of Tsukuba, Toru Kodama held various posts in industry, academia and government. For example, he previously worked as a legal and investment officer for Dentsu, one of the world's largest advertising agencies, and as a policy analyst for the Office of Science and Innovation at the Swedish Embassy in Tokyo. He was also a full time associate professor in the field of intellectual property law and creative industries at Kyushu University and a visiting scholar at Columbia University School of Law. Toru received a B.Eng. degree from Tokyo Metropolitan University and a M.A. degree in International Public Policy from Osaka University. And, after completing the Postgraduate Diploma in Law Course at the University of Exeter and the Bar Vocational Course at BPP Law School, he was Called to the Bar by the Middle Temple in London. He also received a LL.M. degree from King's College London.
